This new year Morag and I went up to a Hogmanay ceilidh in Glasgow with friends. On the previous day we had walked around

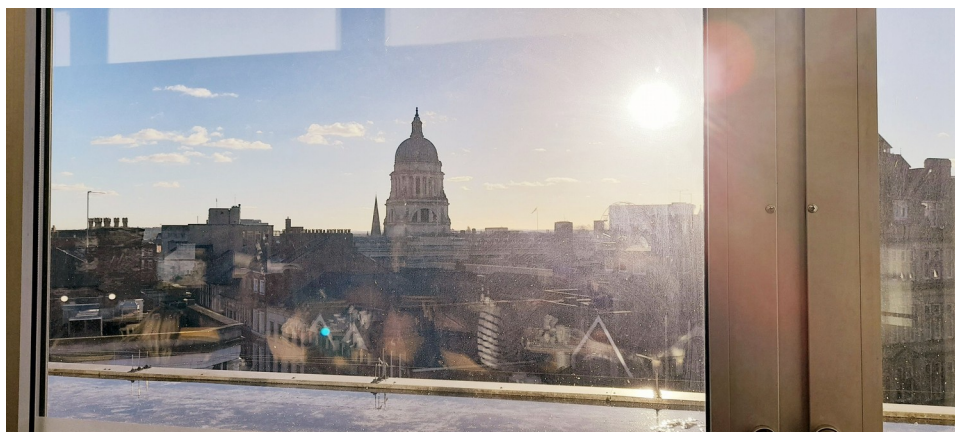


some of the mural trail in Glasgow. There has been a growing number of

There are extensive gardens at RHS Bridgwater of various types, as well as various walks in beautiful settings. The site also has three cafes where you can buy drinks and/or lunch.

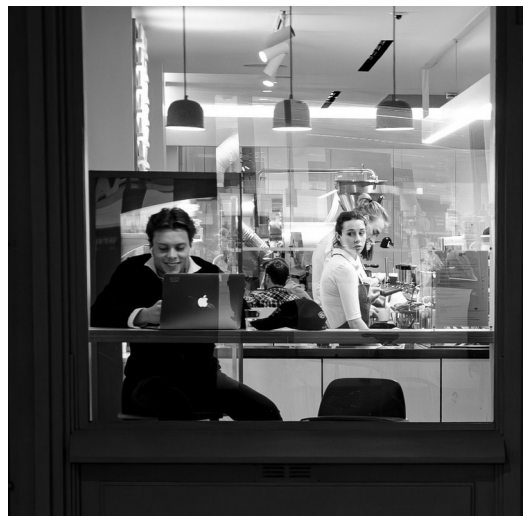

A message from the Third Age Trust

To give u3as a more powerful voice, the Third Age Trust is considering changes to its governance. Change is being driven by the u3a Board of Trustees, all of whom are u3a members with twelve being elected regional or national Trustees.

In order to improve the skill set of Board members and allow elected representatives of regions and nations more time to attend to matters concerning their member u3as, we believe the u3a movement requires this change.

The vision is for a smaller elected Board to handle governance alongside a regionally and nationally elected Council, with delegated powers, representing u3as. This will also provide a vitally needed forum where u3as' ideas, concerns and experiences can be discussed and used to shape decision making. We are testing how this model might work through a 'Pilot Council'.

Can you help your region? The Pilot Council needs a second person in addition to the Regional Trustee to articulate the views and ideas from the East Midlands region. Each region has a second person represented but we do not have a member in this role from this region.

Could this person be you? The representative will act as a conduit between u3as and the pilot council and be able to feed their views and ideas into the discussions.

u3a Guitar Fun Strummers Concert 2023



14th December saw the first ever concert given by Guitar Fun Strummers, a lively and diverse band of guitar players, operating from St Wilfrid's Church Hall, in Wilford village. The event was designed for family and friends of Strummers members as a cautious foray into live performance. Leader of the group, Gordon, explains:

"We had been operating from our St Wilfrid's base since January 2022 and had doubled in size. We wanted to have a new focal point to work towards and decided that a concert event would fit the bill. Some of our members were reluctant to go full scale public at the first attempt, so we agreed to make the event solely for a small number of family and friends.



We started practising for our concert in summer 2023 and eventually whittled our song selection to 15 songs, with scope for a 4-song encore – if we got one! I'm pleased to say that we did and the event was a great success, much enjoyed by members and guests. Refreshments and nibbles were provided and we enjoyed socialising after the concert. It was clear that

everyone had enjoyed the event and the audience had fun participating in singing along to some of the songs.

As a group, we cater for members with a range of guitar skills, mainly "beginner", to "intermediate", playing ability. The minimum requirement, is a reasonable grasp of a range of some basic open chords. Some of our members are proficient to a much higher level, but enjoy the different challenge and social nature of being part of a strumming group. Our aim is to make strumming inclusive for all of the members, without undue pressure on technical excellence. Singing is optional.

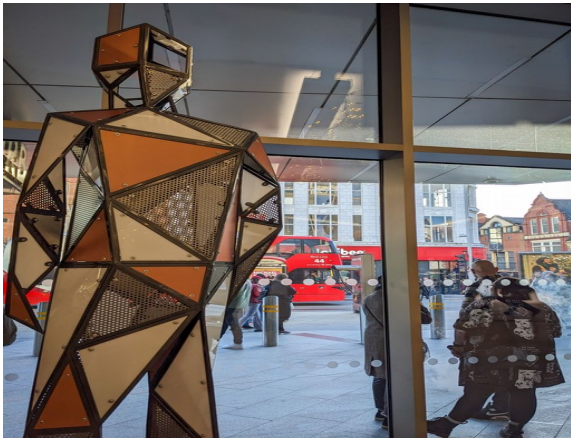

Rushcliffe Move and Mingle

Rushcliffe Move and Mingle is a voluntary organisation that operates well being walks in the borough under the umbrella of Ramblers Wellbeing Walks.

Walks take place weekly at 5 separate locations in the borough:

- Lady Bay and Holme Pierrepont on Tuesdays at 11.00
- Rushcliffe Country Park on Wednesdays at 10.30
- Radcliffe-on-Trent on Thursdays at 10.30
- East Leake Meadow Park on Thursdays at 13.30 and
- Cotgrave Country Park on Fridays at 14.00.

Walks are free for members of the public and are led by trained leaders. The aim is to improve both the physical and mental well being of participants, and at some locations there is the possibility of stopping for refreshment after the walk.

Orienteering Walking Group – December Walk

Our December walk marked a departure from our usual format, being a cross between a hike and an orienteering walk. We started out in Barton-in-Fabis & took in the neighbouring village of Thrumpton, as well as making an ascent & descent of Cottagers & Gotham Hills.

Conditions underfoot were very damp in places & as everyone had forgotten to bring with them their 50 Metre Breast Stroke Certificates – a U3A H&S requirement – it was decided to reroute the walk around the more problematic areas.



In doing so, we spared a thought for occupants of Trent Side – the riverside dwellings north west of Barton-in-Fabis. The houses there were only accessible by small boat, but the residents were no longer sure if these could be used, due to the “Stop the Boats” campaign.



The group normally stops for a “Tea and Banana” break en route, but we decided Santa got his dates wrong this year, visiting Thrumpton 11 days early with locals decorating the nearby woods to help his reindeers find their way there. Rudolph & his team are clearly not as good at navigating as our orienteering group are.

Cottagers & Gotham Hills are not exactly Everest, but they are two of the highest points in Rushcliffe, with heights a staggering 300 feet above sea level. Glorious views of the Trent Valley and its “inland sea” are available from the summit.

It is not exactly clear what two of our group were up to on the summit, but given their proximity to Gotham, it is possible their behaviour was influenced by the Wise Men of Gotham tales. In these stories village residents feigned lunacy to avoid the King's tax collector.



After our walk we had lunch at the Dovecote Barn cafe where your writer was tempted by the cream laden mocha.

By contrast, our January walk took us to Loughborough - to unearth a murderer.

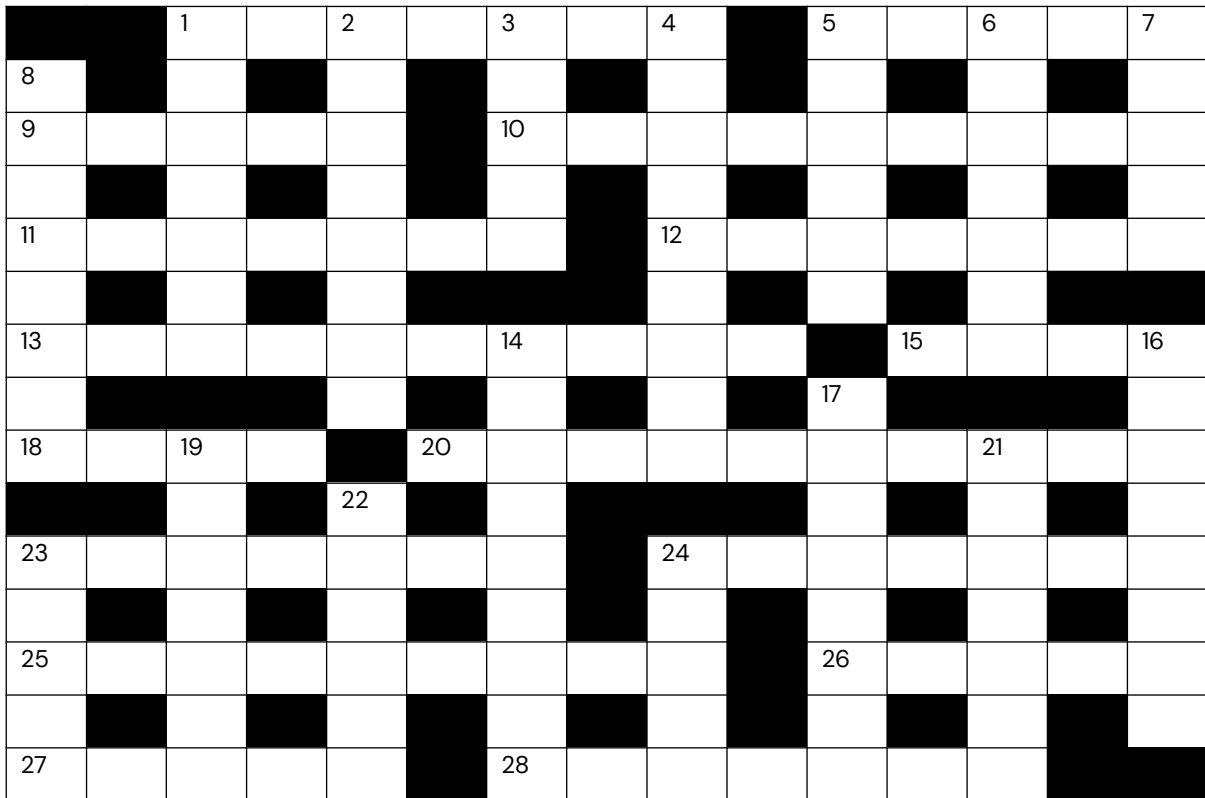
