

#### A rather belated Happy New Year to all our members!

For our Open Meeting in December the Speaker was David Skillen, on The Art of the Monologue. David had assembled an interesting collection of monologues, which he read with appropriate accents.



Stanley Holloway clearly brought back memories to many in the audience, with classics such as *The Lion and Albert* and *The Battle of Hastings* – 'On 'is 'orse', with 'is 'awk' in 'is 'and'.

Another well-known speaker was shown both with his coonskin cap and in a smart suit. Davy Crockett, the 'King of the Wild Frontier', was a Congressman for Tennessee in the 1830s. As well as speaking 'on the stump', Crockett wrote a speech on 'how to give a stump speech' which included tips about kissing babies, promising all that is asked, and more than was asked ... 'because promises cost nothing, therefore deny no-one that has a vote a promise'. In 1835, Crockett failed to get



re-elected, and left the State with the words 'You can all go to hell – I'm going to Texas'; he died at the Alamo the following year.

We also appreciated Joyce the Librarian, which ends with the lines:

She gave herself gladly,
Wildly, madly,
To George that night in his bed.
But then just as she'd feared
George disappeared
Some other librarian to woo.
Now there's a sob in her voice
As both book and Joyce
Are a fortnight overdue.

After adjourning to the Main Hall, we enjoyed mince pies and Christmas cake while being entertained by Sue Bailey and members of her Singing for Fun group.



#### **Hiking Group**

On a typical mild winter day in December, some 19 members of the Hiking Group ventured out to enjoy a short 5 mile pre-Christmas hike from Car Colston. The weather was cloudy, with some occasional light drizzle, but otherwise agreeable.

Starting at the popular Royal Oak pub, we headed south to the small market town of Bingham. After crossing the busy railway line, we stopped for coffee in the attractive churchyard of St Mary's & All Saints. This church is the oldest building in Bingham. It was built in the 13th and early part of the 14th centuries during the reign of King Edward I. It is a fine example of early English Gothic architecture (Grade 1 listed). The church was open, allowing some of us, with an interest in history, to pay our respects to Sir Richard de Bingham who died circa 1308 – 14.



This medieval knight was Lord of the Manor and High Sheriff of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire. His tomb is marked by an effigy carved in the finest Derbyshire alabaster. It would have been brightly painted in the 14th century but all colours have long since faded (see photo).

We can thank his son William in 1314 for securing a royal charter to hold a market in Bingham every Thursday - a tradition and on-going event still appreciated today, 700 years later.

After leaving St Mary's we headed NE towards the village of Scarrington and then back to Car Colston and the Royal Oak pub. 15 of us prebooked (in October!) to stay for an excellent 2 course Christmas meal in the cosy festive ambience of this popular pub, complete with log fires, crackers, drinks, creative hats (well done Sylvia and Kevin) and seasonal charm.



The benefits of social walking in the countryside are self-evident to many of us in the U3A (viz: exercise, fresh-air, companionship and beautiful countryside, whatever the weather or season). Nature (flora and fauna) is a variable that never loses its attraction. However, not all benefits may be visually self-evident and external. Recent research suggests there may be direct cognitive benefits in being in the great outdoors. It seems endorphins and dopamine are released in our brains which

may improve our immune systems, reduce stress, and increase feelings of well-being. According to the experts you should sleep better. It works for me.

If you are persuaded by this advocacy, and interested in joining us, do not hesitate to contact me or my successor Kevin Andrews. Contact details are on the U3A web site. New members are always welcome. After more than 5 years in the role, this Christmas hike was my last as Group Leader. I have enjoyed the challenge of planning walks but felt it was time to hand over the leadership to a younger U3A generation. Kevin will take over from me in January 2023. 

On a brass monkey day twelve intrepid cyclists set off at 10.00 from our usual starting place of Welbeck Road by the suspension bridge. Since the start of the group, some twelve years ago, this ride followed by a Christmas lunch has been a highlight of our year, but this day has to be one of the coldest. At 10.00 there was still frost on the ground.

We set off along the banks of the river to Wilford Village to then follow the river to Clifton Grove. At this point we left the river and took the track up to Clifton Village to continue through Clifton to Ruddington and Rushcliffe County Park, here we stopped for a coffee break.



Since our last group visit to this location a new cafe has opened with outdoor seating only. On this very cold day the picnic type bench seating was still covered in frost. It became a quick moving around coffee stop to try and keep warm. (it's a pity Rushcliffe council didn't have the same foresight as Gedling council, their flagship park has a café with indoor seating as you would expect for an established country park).

We continued our ride into Ruddington village and along Wilford Road to the tram line which we followed back to Wilford and the river. The final section along the riverbank to Trent Bridge and a lunch destination of the Waterside Restaurant, a total distance of sixteen miles. This is an ideal location for our group as there is a large open patio area where we can safely leave our bikes.



At this point, we were joined by other more sensible group members who didn't take part on the ride, for our very enjoyable lunch. About one hour into the lunch, my finger ends and toes started to feel like they belonged to me again!!

Thanks again to Pete for organising this group for another very successful year and we look forward to continuing in 2023.
