Papplewick Pumping Station 8th November



Britain's finest surviving Victorian Pumping Station, Papplewick was built in 1882-1885 and supplying water until 1969 and now is a museum.

The Station is a Scheduled Ancient Monument, the highest preservation order that be bestowed upon a building in England. This means that the majority of the site is accessible to all but due to the historical nature of the Engine House access is via a small flight of steps leading to the porch and main door; there are also internal stairs for reaching the upper floors.

The cost is £5 per person and lifts, if needed, will be available.



Burton Joyce & District u3a Trip to the Thursford Christmas Spectacular - Monday 13th November



It is a while since we have been to this extravaganza of non-stop, singing, dancing, music, humour and variety. It is a fast-moving celebration of the festive season featuring an eclectic mix of both seasonal and year-round favourites. With a cast of 120 professional singers, dancers and musicians, most of whom are straight from the West End, this is the biggest Christmas show of its kind in Europe! It is set in the magical surroundings of mechanical organs and fairground carousels with the auditorium ablaze with colour. It features famous and much-loved chart toppers being performed alongside traditional carols. Please note the finale of the show includes a flyover of white doves across the auditorium. The Christmas Spectacular 2022 show was the biggest yet. We have booked 52 seats and 40 places have already been booked, so if you would like to come with us please don't delay.

The itinerary for the day is that we will leave from outside the parade of shops in Burton Joyce at 8.30 a.m., then after a break during the journey, will arrive at the Refectory at Walsingham Priory for a 2-course roast Christmas lunch, mince pies, tea or coffee. Thursford is only a short distance away and we will continue our journey at 1 p.m. in readiness for the 2 p.m. matinee performance. The cost is £80.50, made up of £16.50 per person for the coach, £16 lunch and £48 for the performance ticket. This compares with £67, the price five years ago. Historians Go To Bolsover

On a perfect sunny day in August the History Group visited Bolsover Castle built in the 1630s by William Cavendish, the grandson of Bess of Hardwick. We had two amazing guides and enjoyed hearing about his aim to make it a weekend

retreat castle for fun and pleasure.





He always hoped for royal preferment and entertained Charles 1 and Henrietta Maria there in the 1634. No expense was spared from enormous feasts to Ben Johnson writing a play for the occasion. The one day of royal entertainment there cost £10 000, the modern equivalent of £4 million. We won't mention the imprisonment of starving lead miners who had had the temerity to petition the King for relief on his journey there.

William Cavendish is the man who schooled horses kindly in the ménage. This kept horses busy and trained when they were not on the battlefield and it evolved into dressage. The book he wrote about this is still the training manual used today. He was so good that he became tutor the son of the King, later Charles II.

His other claim to fame from our point of view is that he built Nottingham Castle. The one burnt down in the Reform riots of 1831.

There were so many stories and we can really recommend a visit. And don't miss the cream tea, absolutely delicious.
